Let's make our own unique vessels

In antiquity, vessels took on various shapes and sizes depending on their intended use. When examining a vessel, we can see that it is made up of different parts, such as the neck, body, and base, each possessing its own unique shape. We suggest that you choose 3 different sized vessels from your home kitchen, make their molds and then combine them to make a new vessel, stacking them in any way you like.



Materials

- White A4 paper
- Scissors to cut the paper into strips and pieces of different sizes
- 1 cup of flour
- 2 cups of water

- 1 bowl and a spoon
- Toilet paper roll
- 3 utensils of your choice, of different sizes
- Plastic wrap

Instructions

Cut the papers into strips and pieces of different sizes.

In a bowl, combine the water and flour and stir with a spoon to create a thick mixture. As a general guideline, the proportion for the mixture is one part flour to two parts water. Wrap your utensil with a piece of plastic wrap and turn it upside down so you can see the base.

Next, dip one of the cut-out pieces of paper into the flour mixture, drain it and

place it on the utensil. Keep going until you have covered the entire surface. When you're done, do the same with the rest of the utensils and let them dry overnight.

The following day, gently separate the utensil from its mold. You now have 3 molds that you can stack as you wish to create your own unique vase.
